Under the direction of the Project Manager:

- Complete necessary training in historical document research methods
- Work closely with the Battlefields Trust to undertake research of historical documents, including archive and web-based documents, relating to the Battle of Otterburn
- Compile and share research with key contacts and other volunteers to aid investigations and help towards the development of engaging visitor interpretation
